

# Denne Michele Norris is an accomplished author, an indemand public speaker, and the former fiction editor at Apogee Journal and The Rumpus.

Her critically acclaimed short stories have appeared in the anthologies: Everyday People: The Color of Life, and Forward: 21st Century Flash Fiction. Her writing has also appeared in ZORA, American Short Fiction, and McSweeney's.

Norris studied English in college but when she graduated, she knew she wanted to pursue writing in a more practical way. "Studying literature is different from studying craft, which really boils down to the mechanics of how someone writes literature well. I wanted to feel like I had a toolbox filled with various techniques at my disposal. My MFA was the chance to study writing from the writer's perspective, with a specific eye towards technique and practice. It was also incredibly valuable time because I could focus on writing without having to build it into a life filled with more pressing things, like earning a living to pay bills."

Norris says she first discovered <u>Electric Literature</u> a decade ago while studying fiction at <u>Sarah Lawrence College</u>. Then in 2021, Norris would be empowered to lead the online publication, and in doing so, she would become the first black and openly trans editor-in-chief of a major U.S. literary publication. Her reputation quickly grew as she was aptly listed as a 2021 Out100 Honouree, and <u>Electric Literature</u> won the 2022 Whiting Literary Magazine Prize.

"I think the biggest surprise has been the way that *Electric Literature* has positioned me in the publishing industry. It's been so wonderful because in many ways, I'm the face of the organization. I get to drive our editorial vision, and I get to impact the publishing industry in some pretty significant ways. Obviously, I'd been aware of EL, and reading EL, since its inception, but I wasn't expecting the job to impact me in this way. I can enter any room filled with writers and publishers and people know who I am. I'm still not used to that visibility, but it's a powerful tool in my efforts to affect change in publishing, and in identifying talented writers from various, under published communities."

Although Norris has numerous literary accolades, one of her most impressive feats is simply living openly as her authentic self. Her public image as a positive role model to the trans and queer community while experiencing intersectional bias makes her struggles and triumphs more eye-catching and deeply felt. Not only is she opening doors for other struggling artists, but she's holding it open for people from marginalized communities.



"Keeping in mind that EL has long been a publisher and advocate of queer writers, I assumed that I would get frequent submissions from trans and gender non-conforming writers when I got the job—if for no other reason than the amount of press my hiring received. But several months in, we were in the middle of another Dave Chappelle inspired discourse, and not only had I received very few submissions from these writers—I wasn't even looking for pieces on Dave Chappelle, just general submissions from trans and gender nonconforming writers—but I wasn't seeing trans people of colour platformed or uplifted during those weeks. The vast majority of folks who defended our community in the media, were not trans, and didn't really know enough about trans people or trans experience, to effectively advocate on our behalf. Now, I can't just go and get someone booked on CNN—I'm not that powerful. But emerging writers who publish at EL are read, every day, by literary agents and editors. Publishing on our site can lead directly to a major book deal. And if more trans writers are being published, more trans writers will be visible, and will have opportunities to speak out for us in the future. But I had to find these writers. It became about building a pipeline, so that when this happens again in 5 years, there's a whole cadre of people living at the intersection of race and transness who are well positioned to speak up."

Norris has made a commitment to searching out work from people that may not be published elsewhere, because all genuine stories are valid and should be celebrated. Norris has begun working on an essay with **Addiei Tsai**, and *Electric* Literature will be covering Camonghne Felix's forthcoming book as well, both of which she is excited to share with her readers.

As for the future she says, "I am knee deep right now in drafts of essays for both/and, our new limited essay series by trans and non-binary writers of colour, and this is the most rewarding work I've done as an editor so far—in my entire career. These 16 pieces are filled with nuance and newness, and they are more authentic than anything I've ever read. Look out for them because they will be published in spring/summer 2023."

If you're looking for other vital readings by provocative artists pushing forward in their craft, Norris states. "Recommended Reading and The Commuter, our acclaimed literary journals. are doing this on a weekly basis. Our book lists are often relevant to current events and serve as resources to our readers who want to know where they can find reliable information to better understand what's going on in the world. This book list that was published in March, just days after the invasion of Ukraine, is a perfect example of that."



Norris prizes accessibility, and states, "At EL, everything we publish is available for free online. More access for readers to good literature means a better world for everyone: I really believe that."

Also, make sure to buy Norris' debut novel, When the Harvest Comes, which was sold to Random House in early November. "I'm in the editorial process with my amazing editor, and I couldn't be happier. In general, I find more joy in the revising and editing process, than I do in the process of generating new work."

It seems Norris isn't content with just being lifted up to new heights. She demands a bridge be built behind her with an accessibility ramp to provide everyone with an equitable chance to succeed regardless of their physical characteristics, sexual orientation, and gender identity, and for all our sakes I hope she never slows down.

points.

Are you ready to feel empowered to a point where you're able to transform your life in and out of the bedroom? In and out of the closet? Upside down and inside out? Well, however you dig it and wherever you like it, Sex and Empowerment Coaches, Katie, Lindsey, and Madison of Pleasure Positive Living can help us queer folk harness our true passion and power, connect with our wildest desires, and live our most pleasure positive lives.

"You are a creator, leader, innovator, and teacher. A bad-ass, you are seen, you are known, you are loved." Whether it's a self-worth reset you're looking for, a want to overcome sexual shame, confusion or frustration, fresh hot sex tips you're seeking, or perhaps you're curious about unlocking a deeper level of intimacy with a partner or with yourself—whatever you can dream of, fantasize, or think up, they can provide you the ultimate roadmap to attain.

Katie, Lindsey, and Madison are the spicy wranglers and no-BS hosts of a top-rated sexuality podcast, *The Pleasure Positive Podcast*, formerly known as *Clit Talk*—but it's not strictly for women, they're all about helping men too. They've interviewed doctors, sexperts, celebrities, porn stars, you name it, they've talked to them and there's no topic that's untouchable, having created over 250 episodes with a following of 40,000 + listeners in more than 180 countries.



"It all started at a bachelorette party in Palm Springs. Madison was given a very unique gift by our friend - a book called *Pussy: A Reclamation* by **Regena Thomashauer**. At this point, none of us were on the path to sexual empowerment just yet. Katie was a 31-year-old woman who had never masturbated, Madison was soon-to-be-married into a monogamous heteronormative relationship but had a massive secret crush on a lady and Lindsey didn't understand why she wanted to grab all her girlfriends in naughty places even though she had a long-term boyfriend."

The three friends were so enamoured by the book, they decided to start a book club which launched them into conversations they never had before. It didn't take them long to realize their hunger to explore their sexualities and to inevitably discover the missing links in their lives. "If us women were seeking this type of transformation around our sexuality, we thought there must be others out there too, so we launched the podcast, *Clit Talk*."

Since the launch of *Clit Talk* (now *Pleasure Positive Living*) Madison came out as queer in her now polyamorous marriage and has been dating women, Katie discovered masturbation and its health benefits, and Lindsey tapped into her desire and truth to be fluid. "Inclusion is very important to us while a lot of our listeners are female identifying our podcast is not gender specific and we wanted everyone to know they were welcome, that sexual empowerment and pleasure are everybody's birthright."

"I now explore what people would call an open relationship. It feels free, scary and I'm sure some people will judge me for my lifestyle but for me it's my truth and I believe everybody deserves to live their truth whatever it may be. Am I bisexual? Heteroflexible? Pansexual? I don't know. Labels don't empower me," shared Lindsey. "Over the years how I identify has shifted. Bisexual turned to pansexual and then eventually what resonated the most was queer," Madison added.

If you're wondering why they changed their podcast name from *Clit Talk* to *Pleasure Positive*, it was due to the restriction of expression—yes, that's right—apparently "clit" is viewed as an offensive word. "*iTunes* starred out our name, so it looked like "C\*\*t Talk. We don't understand why the word clit would be censored. It's short for clitoris which is the pleasure center and a very fun part of the vulva anatomy."

Their plans for the future are commendable ones at that, and very much needed when thought about from a progressive stance. "One of our dreams is to have a TV show. Our biggest goal is going mainstream, which was a huge reason for our name change. We want to normalize the word clit, so it is no longer considered profane, and not banned or censored." They live to see the tides turn, and they aim to be the change they want to see. Power to them.

"We are committed to bringing what some people would consider taboo conversations in a way that anyone can participate. I always say one man's taboo is another man's Tuesday, right?" In their podcast, Katie, Lindsey, and Madison go all out, try all the boundary-pushing sexcapades, confront and disrupt shame, then hop on the air to tell their listeners all the gritty details. Some special LGBTQ+ topics in the past have included conversations on non-binary, gender identity, coming out, the future of fluidity, queer movies, queer celebrities, transgender therapists, cock talk and masculinity.

"With two out of three of us being queer, we openly share our journey as well as current experiences throughout the whole show." You can hear about queer experiences in practically every episode from what Lindsey and Madison divulge about their personal lives. "What we've discovered, no matter what your sexual orientation, communication is the number one thing needed when it comes to positive pleasurable sexual experiences. Many people have come out in their relationships as queer, bisexual and pansexual out of listening to our show or participating in our programs."



Their website offers support in creating a lifestyle where pleasure is clearly and obviously the star of the show, as it should be. They provide resources through their podcast, social media, and *YouTube*, as well as their exclusive online courses and membership community with pleasure education. "Sex is only one part of that." They have one-on-one coaching, various digital products, and free masterclasses and workshops to indulge in too.

Coming in March, they'll be launching their Sex & Empowerment Signature Masterclass: A roadmap to regain self-love, harness your true voice, and live a turned-on life. Their free workshop series Confidence Under the Covers is happening in February—visit their website for more information and to sign up for their masterclasses, workshops, and courses offered.

It's time to wake up your deepest pleasures from their slumber. Poke the sleeping bear. Or maybe your bear is already awake, wide-eyed, and bushy-tailed but it's ready to take pleasure to a whole other level. Intimacy has no limits. Pleasure has no limits. Be limitless. Be open. Be free. Be love. "Give yourself permission experience pleasure in everything you do."

# Happy Divorce Day, Valentine!



Having happily resigned myself to being a confirmed life-long bachelor, I feel the need to encourage queer married couples in my circle to at least consider the possibility of breaking up—especially during this time of the Valentine.

Fun fact: To celebrate the month of love or the lack thereof, I create my own Post-Valentine's Day cards and eagerly hand them out to all.

Now, with queer marriage and unions legal in almost 30 countries as it stands today, my curiosity got the better of me. What is the divorce rate like?


In Canada, queer individuals have been legally able to tie the rainbow knot since 2005, but it was the court ruling of Halpern v. Canada in 2003 that got the ball rolling. Though the LGBTQIA community had been fighting for legalization of queer marriage for decades, this new push began in 2000 when Toronto's Reverend Brett Hawkes began issuing proclamations of marriage (or "banns") at the Metropolitan Community Church of Toronto. These "banns" allowed couples such as Hedy Halpern and her partner Colleen Rogers to begin a legal challenge to the marriage ban. They eventually won.

In June of 2003, the government passed the Civil Marriage Act, making same-sex marriage (and divorce) lawful across the fair land. But before the brides could

kiss there was a hitch; the Court of Appeal for Ontario's jurisdiction couldn't override federal law. This meant that although it was legal in Ontario and technically legal across Canada, it was not federally official until 2005.

Over the years, studies have found that the "first-wave gay marriages have proved more durable than straight ones, but not expected to last." This means that as time goes on, queer people won't see marriage as "special" and "new." Still, statistics prove that worldwide the queer divorce rate is less than that of heterosexual couples.

Not surprisingly, two out of three married same-sex couples are lesbians, which might explain the unusual rate of lesbian divorce. Where the divorce rate for gay male couples is 16% and heterosexual couples have a divorce rate of 19%, those happy U-Haul lesbians have a whopping 34% divorce rate.





#### **Queer Celebrity Divorces**

The queer creatures below, with their millions of dollars and celebrity stylists, couldn't make their marriages work, so how can you?

- Actor Elliot Page and Emma Portner married in 2017 and filed for divorce in 2021
- Actor Sara Gilbert and Linda Perry married in 2014 and divorced in 2019
- Glee actor Cheyenne Jackson was together with physicist, Monte Lapka, for 13 years—married in 2014 and divorced in 2016
- Melissa Etheridge and Tammy Lynn Michaels married in 2003 and filed for what ended up being the longest and nastiest queer divorce ever in 2010
- Rosie O'Donnell and Kelli Carpenter married in 2004 and divorced in 2007
- Rosie O'Donnell and Michelle Rounds married in 2012 and divorced in 2015
- Figure skater-turned-sports commentator, Johnny Weir, married Victor Voronov in 2014 and filed for a bitter divorce two years later
- Actor Jane Lynch married psychologist, Lara Embry, in 2010 and filed for divorce in 2013
- Colton Haynes and Jeff Leatham married in October of 2017 and divorced six-months later amid cheating allegations
- Actor Lena Waithe and Alana Mayo married in 2019 and filed for divorce two months later

It's obvious that while marriage and coupling is not in my cards, except my Post-Valentine's Day cards, it seemingly has worked out for the majority of gay men who chose to tie the knot.


I say be more like the divorce-happy lesbians. The pickings are getting slim out here.

# **Denise Benson**



Born in Bowmanville and raised in several small southern Ontario towns, Writer, Researcher, DJ, and Toronto icon, <a href="Denise Benson">Denise Benson</a>'s first inspiration was her mother. "My mom was a very strong, independent woman who had an incredible eye for colour and detail." An antique dealer with interior design skills, Benson's mother read voraciously and loved music.

It was through her mom's eclectic record collection that Denise began her own love affair with music. Mixing tapes from the radio at the age of 7, she DJ'ed her grade 8 graduation dance, and at various high school events.

In Toronto's late '80s, actively interested in social history as part of coming out, Denise volunteered at CKLN 88.1FM. With access to professional equipment, she made her own demo tape and landed weekly DJ gigs at *Showbiz* and *Nuts & Bolts* before starting the very first Dyke Nite at the *Caribou* in 1990.

"I was always a pretty strong programmer—able to read crowds and play across music genres but didn't learn to properly beat mix for a long time. I still can recall lots of trainwrecks at fairly high-profile gigs and I shudder!" Favourite events include Dyke Nite at the *Boom Boom Room*, SHE Saturdays, Glide Wednesdays at *Gypsy Co-op*, and <u>Cherry Bomb</u>, which she continues with <u>DJ Cozmic Cat</u>.

By the early '90s, Denise was writing for *Exclaim* magazine, then as a columnist in *EYE Weekly*, focusing heavily on electronic music and culture for 15 years. "Toronto was a hotbed—our rave and club scenes were exploding at the time. I was lucky enough to interview many of this city's, and the globe's top talents."

A mom of an active and creative 8-year-old, it may surprise people to know Denise is an introvert who requires silence to write and has struggled with social anxiety—however, that hasn't stopped her from accomplishing great things. Her successful book Then and Now: Toronto Nightlife History has gone through two printings. Also, Denise wrote and narrated the Gaybourhood Music Tour which is interactive and can be downloaded at ON-FOOT.

Doing story research and writing for TV and film over the past 5+ years with *Bangor Films*, director **Chris Remerowski** approached Denise with an idea; a queer take on electronic/dance music. "The project grew to explore connections between 2SLGBTQ+ people and electronic dance music, from the origins of house to today's massive rave culture." Titled *OUTRAVE*, it can be found on Revry, a global streaming network focused on queer content and creators. The aim is to develop this into a city-centric docu-series, with the first episode hosted by Benson, focusing on Toronto.

"My favourite part is getting to speak with queer club and rave contributors—from scene-builders to trailblazers, about why it's always about more than a party for queer and trans people. It's a significant time to talk about queer and trans contributions to electronic/dance music culture and why this matters."

Cat Grant (OCAD) is a multidisciplinary artist.

Starting her career in dance and music, painting and photography are her main focus now. As a published poet, Cat is also the Executive Director for Toronto's Goddess Day Arts Festival.

# A KODAK MOMENT Lyn McGinnis



Lyn McGinnis is an epic, utopian fantasy series author with an approximate eight novels under their belt–favouring the medium of a typewriter or a pencil and paper. A very talented and creative writer, Lyn's work is being compared to other extraordinary epic series greats. Openly bisexual and gender variant, Lyn is also an LGBTQ+ activist and personal support worker.

**Boyd Kodak** - What have you been doing over the last year?

**Lyn McGinnis** - In 2022, the first novel of my eight-part epic, utopian fantasy, *Anu Awakes* novel series, *Hesha Vira's Challenge*, came out. This is the culmination of several decades of work growing this fantasy world.

**BK** - What are you looking forward to next year?

**LM** - Early in 2023, the series' second novel, *Amarel Mountain*, will become available. I am about to begin

the process of creating both the e-book and print-ondemand (physical book) versions.

**BK** - Where can we see your work?

**LM** - Hesha Vira's Challenge may be purchased in e-book form wherever you buy your online reading material. The print-on-demand version may be acquired from Amazon, Barnes & Noble, Walmart, Powell's Books, and Books-A-Million. It is also available through the following wholesale networks: Ingram, Baker & Taylor, Nacscorp, Bookazine, and BPDI Corp.

**BK** - Future plans?

**LM** - My intention is to publish one additional novel per year for the next seven years.

**BK** – Any message you would like to put out there?

**LM** - As someone who identifies as both a bisexual and genderqueer person, there are many queer aspects woven through the narrative of my novel series. This includes polyamorous social units where everyone is bisexual. There are two honoured classes of genderqueer characters. The 'Betweens' are genderqueer and serve as bridges between the genders. The 'Completes' are intersex and are venerated as perfect and complete beings.

**BK** - Finish the following sentence for us, "life wouldn't be the same without ..."

**LM** - A vision. My novels are set on the planet, Anu. There are two species; two of the main characters belong to an upright bipedal group, the Tolku. The other is a quadrated creature, the Suvuka. The two Tolku are on opposite sides of a division brought about by a rapidly changing world. This is the advent of a life system called Tatchlan, which will remake Anu into a society free of self-absorption. One of these Tolku is young Shuna-Shapta; she is on the verge of becoming a Tatchlan Master. Seti is an itinerate boy with mental challenges who, through visions, sees himself as a prophet of an old religion long opposed to Tatchlan. The Suvuka is named Sinkin; he is also a youth. He will undergo a trial of initiation into adulthood. His species lost a war of aggression with the Tolku and now are banished to a third of their former homeland. These characters move through an ancient landscape towards surprising meetings and an unexpected conclusion to their separate journeys.

# BEYOND THE VILLAGE

# SIRKEL FOODS



Sirkel Foods is a small takeout restaurant located across from City Hall in downtown Stratford, Ontario. Open since 2007, run by chef and co-owner, Kelly, the restaurant is adorned with rainbow logos, prideful door decals, and a menu which includes the Rainbow-wich, Pride-wich, and LGBTQ+wich—they even put up a rainbow tree at Christmas. They will be closed for a week this March for renovations, the work will include painting a feature wall with a big rainbow for photo-taking opportunities and an entire wall showcasing their menu. Sirkel Foods is a plethora of rainbows and pride, where all are welcomed to an inclusive and supportive environment, and where everyone can feel comfortable.

Although they were originally an eat-in venue, at the start of the pandemic they changed to takeout only and have maintained this format. *Sirkel Foods* is a woman-centered operation, with 2 female owners, a staff of 15 women and one man. Their regular clientele is comprised of local people working in the downtown neighbourhood dropping in for a quick bite, or to take something more substantial home to share with family and friends. *Sirkel Foods* currently does not offer public washrooms—when they were open for eat-in service, they did offer an accessible facility which they now maintain for gender neutral staff use. Otherwise, the space is handicap accessible, with a large, wide front door for ease of entrance.

The menu for this little gem is eclectic and intriguing—with soups, sandwiches, salads, mains, and sweet treats. They feature a Jacked-Up Mac and Cheese, which changes daily but could be topped with pulled pork and coleslaw or bruschetta or butter chicken with mango chutney or bacon supreme. Their most popular offerings include the Meatloaf Sandwich, Dream-wich (goat cheese, red pepper jelly, chicken, and arugula), and BBQ Chicken Caesar Salad. The Ewen-wich appealed greatly to me, with smoked turkey, bacon, Swiss cheese, sundried tomato mayo, tomatoes, cucumbers, and arugula. Chef Kelly prepares everything on site and is happy

to accommodate dietary restrictions and food allergies. They have gluten free baking, bread, salad dressings and stir fry sauce, and they can make vegan, dairy free, gluten free, nut free versions of items.

Beverage options are straightforward: pop, juice, water, coffee, and tea. They are located in a safe area but a little while ago, the rear door, window, and dumpster were vandalized with hate speech. The situation was upsetting to the owners and staff, and to other local businesses who responded by displaying rainbow flags in support of *Sirkel Foods* and the 2SLGBTQ+ community at large. The Festival Theatre ran a "GoFundMe" which raised enough money to install security cameras and a large back light. Kelly has also worked with the local Pride group to raise funds to install the first Pride crosswalk in Stratford. Sadly, it was vandalized the first night, illustrating how much work remains to be done in the fight for acceptance and equality. Displaying community resilience, Kelly and the Pride group will work to have the rainbow Pride colours repainted.

This place is definitely worth a visit, with glowing reviews across Facebook, Yelp, and Trip Advisor platforms, each boasting an average 4.5 stars. "We are just a small takeout restaurant, owned by two women who pour their heart and soul into everything we do at Sirkel Foods. We care about our customers and enjoy making delicious food for them. We would be nowhere without our community."




