CHRISTOPHER RICE

Co-Authoring With His Mother For The First Time

It seems fittingly natural that the son with an acclaimed author as a mother, and established poet as a father, would end up with a career in writing himself. Now nearly two decades after publishing his first novel, he's embarking on yet another of his journeys in life, co-authoring a book with his beloved mother.

Ramses the Damned: The Passion of Cleopatra.

is both a sequel to Anne Rice's 1989 novel, *The Mummy, or Ramses The Damned,* and also a standalone novel. Former lovers Ramses and Cleopatra have been resurrected by the same ancient elixir of immortality. While at odds over the use of their powers, the two are both hunted by an immortal queen, who is even older and more dangerous than themselves.

Rice explained how this collaboration came about. "Ramses was always intended to be a series, but she never got around to writing another Mommy. One day we sat down at her house in the California dessert, mom with her coffee and me with my tea, and things gradually evolved from there." This is the first time he has fully co-authored a novel, however he did mention he's contributed to anthologies in the past.


"We had some differences about the path of the characters, especially with Cleopatra, and sometimes we met in the middle, while other times mother knows best. She wrote the original, and in the end she had the final say on the completed copy for this one. It's all very much written from her world and in her voice," he confided.

The new novel has been termed historical horror, but Rice added he thinks it might be more fittingly referred to as "historical Gothic horror", in a similar style as Stranger Things, which he admitted to being a huge fan of. With regard to it being a standalone novel, Rice explains, "It picks up where the first novel left off, but there's no reason to read or re-read the first one, as the first couple of chapters do a great recap leading into the new story line."

He divulged that readers will find out where the elixir came from, and who invented it. As for queer content, he explains that bisexual character Elliott is back and incited by dark forces. "They're immortals so of course there's going to be lot's of good food and great sex happening. There's one part where Elliott has an intimate same-sex romance."

He wrote his first novel, A Density of Souls, in New Orleans back in 1998 during a time when he was going through some difficult times with his mother being seriously ill. It revolves around the main character Stephen's homosexuality while attending an exclusive New Orleans prep school. It was published in 2000 and went on to become a New York Times bestseller that resonated with both queer and mainstream readers. He also was the recipient of a Lambda Literary Award.

The book was actually based on a short story that he had already written, and he also drew inspiration from several screenplays he had started, but eventually abandoned. "With this being my first novel, I wrote the main character as being a victim." Alhtough some have cited it as autobiograhical with its parallel similarities to Rice's own life, he once confessed, "I did physically model Stephen after myself: I gave him blond hair, I made him tall, I gave him blue eyes. And he is gay. But I wasn't subject to half the brutality he is in the book."



He further explained, "This was actually quite easy to write as critics had nothing to base anything on with it being my first book. It was entirely driven from confronting my mother's illness, as it gave me a time to vent when not in the hospital. Writing was a form of distraction and a therapeutic tool for me. I needed an environment I could control."

As he once explained in an interview, "I think the first book is the one you've been waiting to write, and the second book is not. The second book is the one you have to write with the voices of a bunch of critics in your head." His second novel, Snow Garden, was published in 2002 and is a murder mystery set on a snowbound New England college campus. Although there were gay characters here as well, Rice explained that it was more about identity than sexuality.

His third novel, Light Before Day, was his first piece of work written in the first person. He wrote it in memory of his father, who passed away in 2002. The novel is set within the predominantly gay West Hollywood section of Los Angeles and centres around a young gay journalist. "It was easier than I thought to write. I really got into the voice of the character, as



if it was really my own. Before my father died he told me he didn't trust the first person voice. There was a certain noimess to all of it," he recalled.

He has since gone on to write seven novels, including *The Heavens Rise*, which was nominated for a Bram Stoker Award, but lost to Stephen King's novel, *Dr. Sleep*. If you're going to lose, you might as well lose to one of the best. He also wrote, *Blind Fall*, a suspense thriller about gays in the military, and *The Moonlit Earth*, a psychological thriller set mainly in Hong Kong about terrorism and the manipulation of the media when a gay flight attendant is considered a prime suspect in a hotel bombing. He's also written several works of erotic romance as part of the *1,001 Dark Nights* series. The first of them, *The Flame*, was published in November 2014, and there are now currently five books in the series.

Beyond the excitement of working with his mother on their new novel, the pair will also be collaborating on yet another exciting project, an upcoming television series based on *The Vampire Chronicles*. There are 11 books in the series, which have sold over 100 million copies worldwide. Anne's first novel *Interview with the Vampire* which was published

back in 1979 and was the basis for the 1994 Hollywood blockbuster film of the same name, starring Tom Cruise, Brad Pitt, Kirsten Dunst and Antonio Banderas.

"Yes this is definitely happening, and we've worked out a deal with Paramount Television, and Anonymous Content, who are the creative developers. More details will most likely be announced in early 2018, and fans can stay on top of things by following along on our Vampire Chronicles fan page," Rice happily announced. He will pen the series and serve as executive producer alongside Anne, and Anonymous Content's David Kanter and Steve Golin.

Anne Rice said, "This is a dream come true, both for me, Christopher, and the fans who have been asking to see the Brat Prince Lestat in this medium for years." Christopher added, "The first great day for me on this project was when my mother asked me to partner with her on it, and we're confident this exciting deal will result in many excellent things for Lestat in the universe of television." Rice also mentioned that there's currently some interest as well in adapting his **Density of Souls** novel into a television series, produced by K Period Media, the same team behind *Manchester by the Sea*.

Rice, who will be turning 40 in March of 2018, confessed that at an earlier point in his career he had committed to himself to write more often, as who knows how long we'll be around. By the sounds of it, there's definitely some exciting times ahead for Mr Rice





Glad Day Bookshop describes itself as the "oldest LGBTQ bookstore in the world". But looking at its new Church Street digs, you would never guess that Glad Day has been around since 1970.

Prior to moving to Church, Glad Day was located in a rented space on Yonge Street just north of Wellesley. That's what Erickson and another 22 owners (that number has since grown to 33) bought into in 2012. One of the major issues with the Yonge Street location was that, despite renovations, its two flights of stairs meant it was never fully accessible.

"It wasn't truly open to the community because of accessibility," says Erickson. "If we ever moved, we absolutely had to have a space that had an accessible entrance and an accessible washroom." Although the old space hosted book launches, talks, cabarets and more, it was becoming apparent that the available revenue streams weren't doing enough to keep Glad Day going.

"After trying to break even for five years at the Yonge Street location, it became pretty clear to us that even though we had increased book sales by over 30 per cent, the continuing drop in magazine sales and DVD sales, and the high cost of rent, was going to mean that we were realistically never going to break even at that location."

"So the only options left to us were to either close, or to try a new model with new revenue streams," says Erickson.

"The revenue streams that make the most sense with books is coffee and cocktails." That's where Byzantium, a popular bar and restaurant on Church Street for 23 years, came in. Erickson heard from a friend that the business was quietly up for sale — its liquor license intact and an accessible entrance already in existence. "We were in a competition for it, but luckily the former owners Paul and Pierre advocated for us with the landlord, so we were chosen as the best match for the space."

While the move ended up being a quick one, it had been thought about for years. Yet a spot in the Village wasn't a guarantee. Erickson says they looked at neighbourhoods like Parkdale and Leslieville where LGBTQ communities had formed

"The trick with those areas is that we would end up just serving a very small community," he says. "We didn't want to be a queer and trans-positive space in a predominantly straight neighbourhood. We wanted to be in a queer and trans-dominant space."

"The neighbourhood that's still as queer as it's ever been is the Church and Wellesley neighbourhood," he continues. "We really felt that people were hungry for something a little more indie, a little more diverse, right in the heart of the Village."

So after a year into the big move, what's changed for Glad Day? The answer is a lot. "People are kind of getting used to it, and once they get their head around it they're pretty excited about the space," says Michael Erickson, lead owner of Glad Day.

Today, Glad Day still hosts the book launches, talks, signings, and so on, that customers have gotten used to over the years. And, yes, they're of course still in the business of selling books.







"We've done five times the number of book launches this year as the previous year," says Erickson. "The audiences for the book launches are almost 10 times as large as they were in the old space."

Patrons can also now purchase drinks and food, and enjoy a whole new batch of programs. "People can play a board game; or they can read on the patio. We usually have a lot of people on first dates at Glad Day. It's really cute. With all of our programming too, there's a little bit of something for everyone in the course of a month."

Unsurprisingly, their most popular events are their Friday and Saturday night dance parties. "We really rely on those sales to make rent." It's also become a regular sight to see poetry readings and drag performances outside of Glad Day, its retractable glass windows making this a genius bet. "A lot of the art that happens in the space spills out onto Church Street."

It all just further cements one simple fact for Erickson: "We're actually a part of the community."

Born and raised in Toronto, Daniela Costa graduated from Ryerson University's journalism undergraduate program in 2013. More recently she's begun reviewing movies and recapping television shows that feature queer characters.

WIGGED OUT

DRAG DREAMS REALIZED

I often encounter people who tell me that they want to start doing drag and wonder if I have any advice for them. I usually respond with a simple, "don't!" In part, because I mean it and also because it makes me chuckle. Baby queens are looking to find out how they can make it 'big' and be a regular, working drag queen. There is no handbook or how-to guide. My real advice is simple: believe in yourself.

Years ago, when I decided that being an entertainer was something I was passionate about, I found drag and it was the perfect outlet. At that time it was different than it is today, and even harder to get your start. YouTube, which is full of tutorials on everything from doing makeup to styling wigs, had not taken off, so being inspired meant going to shows and seeking out entertainers. You would hope that perhaps they'd befriend you and help you, allow you to watch them amd do their makeup, then when you showed up at the bar looking like a monster, they'd allow you to do one song during their own show.

Looking back, a lot of things seemed impossible. I never thought I'd ever end up with a regular show or be like the entertainers I had looked up to and learned from. I'd never be pretty or have costumes and wigs that didn't look like I got them from a discount store. I encountered countless critics who told me that I couldn't do certain things, that I wasn't funny or pretty. etc.

Somewhere, deep down I had hope that I could become the goddess that I had imagined myself being. So I worked toward making that a reality for myself; and not for anyone else. Now, I am lucky and privileged to host four regular shows a week (five during the winter), along with working a full time job. Drag granted me the opportunity to travel to places around the world (something I love doing), the ability to continue to work on my craft as an entertainer, and to do a multitude of other things.



I couldn't even begin to to dream about any of this as I stood on stage for the very first time in a flat wig, with awful makeup, and a t-shirt I fashioned into an outfit that said "I love hot dogs". I preformed Diana Ross' "I'm Coming Out" and boy did I ever! Now I look ahead, and I see myself as a fully realized version of what I hoped I could be. It was only achievable because I believed it was possible through my own hard work and dedication.

Katinka Kature performs weekly in Toronto at the following events. Monday and Thursday at Crews and Tangos at 9pm, Wednesday at Woody's at 11pm for Hump Night Hunnies, and Saturday's at Buddies in Bad Times Theatre at 10:30pm.





DJ Cozmic Cat

Paula Burrows (aka DJ Cozmic Cat) has a new album (stocking stuffer!), **#CozmicLove that features 12 tracks** of house music for the dance floor inside your head. I spoke with her about her life and what the future holds for this Toronto born artist.

She has lived around the world with her traveling family, and learned early on to have an appreciation for music. "My father played the flute and the guitar, so my sisters and I all had music lessons," She began spinning in Philadelphia, and her continued success has made her a global hit from Iceland to NYC

"I'm very grateful to be (what I call) a successful artist living off my music, and my DJing. However, it's the journey of becoming what and who I want to be that is the real success. I'm always trying to improve and expand on what I do, so there are many successes in my world, and I'm grateful for all of them."

Her path was not always easy, but perhaps her biggest challenge was her own inner critic. "The hardest part is actually NOT the late nights, the racism or misogyny in the industry, or lack of the right gear or the right vocals, or having enough fans on social media, or signing a major label deal, or a marketing plan, or the weeks and months in the studio. The hardest part always has been and always will be that little voice that says, 'It isn't good enough,' At some point, you just gotta say fuck it, trust your instincts and put it out there regardless of what others (or that little voice) say or think."

Not just a talent, DJ Cozmic Cat has a beautiful presence and a smile that lights up any room. It's a reflection of who she is. This generous soul volunteers her time by mentoring youth. "I like the glamour side of the music biz for sure, but I get my real sense of significance from giving back. People I have mentored have changed my life and made me look at things completely different."

Also, she started her own recording label, Jupiter Productions. as well. "It helps you do your own thing a bit faster by maintaining control, and even though its harder financially, vou learn a lot."

What's coming up next? "I have a few new tracks with different vocalists coming up, a remix for local singer songwriter Jordan B. Wright, and a slew of gigs in support of



the album release. Then it's back in the studio over the winter. and oh ya, chocolate., always lots of chocolate, which is very important for the creative process."







CHRIS GUDGEON



A rash of gay teen suicides in 2010 prompted syndicated sex advice columnist Dan Savage to go on YouTube with his boyfriend Terry Miller to tell gay youth not to despair - "Life Gets Better."

Their message obviously hit a nerve. Within weeks, dozens of celebrities, even President Obama, contributed their own It Gets Better clips. The message was clear - gay youth are not alone, and hopefully as they age they will find supportive communities, and learn how to deal with detractors.

At the time, a group of Canadian celebrities produced a 12-minute video featuring people like Brad Fraser, Diane Flacks, and Rick Mercer talking about how it got better for them. But it was only this past February when someone - namely author Chris Gudgeon - actually founded **It Gets Better Canada**. The new foundation is in its fledgling stages, and much work still needs to be done. Gudgeon has to incorporate, get a Board of Directors, and build a structure for the organization. He also needs to produce YouTube content, form agreements with major organizations, and do some fundraising. But expect "It Gets Better Canada" to become a major player on the queer landscape in the coming years.

"The name of this organization is also its slogan, so that can sometimes seem like we're simplifying things," explained Gudgeon. "To be fair, it didn't start as an organization, it began with a concerned person and an organization started up around him. Dan Savage is no Pollyanna, but he saw the need to connect with positive stories. The fact is, it does get better. You never have to be alone in your struggle."

Gudgeon is a busy person even without his philanthropic work. He is an author with 14 titles to his name. His latest book, the short story collection, "The Encyclopedia of Lies", is a knock-out. He moved from British Colombia to Toronto earlier this year to be closer to his two sons, who attend school in Ontario. A bisexual father of three, he lost one of his sons last year. "I know the pain of losing a child. It wasn't a suicide, but was nevertheless terrible."

Though he has yet to meet Dan Savage, Gudgeon is enthusiastic about his new role helping queer youth. "Our focus is on telling positive stories, and our target audience is young people. We have to give them hope, connect them to the community, and provide them with resources. We also need to decelerate what's going on in their minds, especially if HIV is involved. One difficulty is learning how to negotiate gay culture and the gay world. On the one hand, you're engaging with this community sexually, but you also need this same community to support you. It is confusing, and we'd like to help. We can help youth negotiate their first Pride, for instance. I want them to see it all with joy and wonder."

"It's super easy to make the world a better place," he summarizes. "Just do something nice for somebody."



A KODAK MOMENT Eva Simone

Eva Simone immigrated to Toronto from Jamaica, and has become a vibrant addition to our community. She first organized the performing arts group Rainbow Gleegues Coalition. and has now expanded her advocacy and activism efforts.

Boyd Kodak - What have you been doing over the last year?

Eva Simone - I have expanded my work from my own intersections as a Black, Immigrant, Trans*Woman, I have immersed myself in a number of LGBTQI+ and more Trans and Gender specific focused initiatives at The 519 Church Street Community Centre, which includes focus groups and discussions. I have also participated as an Advisory Committee member in two City of Toronto initiatives around Trans*Identities and Transphobia, namely the 'Toronto for All'- (T4A) Anti-Transphobia Campaign launched in summer of 2017 (an initiative in collaboration with Black Coalition for AIDS Prevention - 'BlackCAP'); and the Toronto Youth Empowerment Project - (TYES) around Policy Development for Service Agencies dealing with Trans*people in Toronto. Also 'TRANScending Love' (T-Love), another BlackCAP led arts based initiative for and by African and Caribbean Trans*Women that focuses on journeys to self-love and acceptance. Additionally, I have become an active member of the Board of Directors for both BlackCAP and the Trans* Human Rights Coalition.

BK - During that time, which was the one most exciting event

ES - To participate as a member of the Advisory Committee of the 'Toronto for All' campaign, and helping to determine the creative direction and final outcome of the campaign was exciting for me. It gave me a firsthand experience of how advertisement campaigns are developed.

BK - What are you looking forward to over for the next year?

ES - Finding more creative opportunities as a performing artist, to immerse myself more into community organizing, and more advocacy work as much as time allows. Travel and see more of the world, fall in-love and maybe break some hearts, or be heart-broken while I'm at it. Fingers-crossed that I'll find some stability and consistency finally. Oh, and it wouldn't hurt to get rich too... giggles

BK - Where can we see your work?



ES - So far most of our previous work as a group has been live performances. Whether recorded versions exist and/or are publicly available, I couldn't say for sure.

BK - Future plans?

ES - Born out of a personal need, I have aspirations of venturing into the apparel industry, which is still in its incubation stage. We'll see.

BK - Any message you would like to put out there?

ES - Sometimes finding personal and collective harmony and cohesiveness in an ever increasing divisive world is seemingly a challenge. However, for me it is important to afford myself love, respect and acceptance, and then be able extend the same to others, even if we don't always agree with each other.

BK - Terrific work, thank you Eva! Now finish the following sentence for us: Life wouldn't be the same without ???

ES - Curried-chicken, chocolate and cheddar

BEYOND THE VILLAGE QUEENS ON KING



The Church/Wellesley Village has always been the crowning jewel of gay Toronto, but in recent years our venues have moved out to other areas of the city as well. Some argue that as we lose the close concentration of LGBT spaces we forgo a certain amount of power and safety as a community, but the flip side is that by being in traditional spaces we expose others to our unique brand of entertainment.

Scarlett BoBo has been hosting a fabulous night at The Red Tomato on King Street West in the heart of the theatre and entertainment district for a few months now. **Queens on King** is a fun cabaret-style show, and the brainchild of Scarlett, her boyfriend Peter, and Dean Maher from 416 Mag.

I asked BoBo about her experience performing for this new crowd of people, "I've actually noticed a difference in the crowd on King Street. I love Church Street to death, don't get me wrong, but because people are so used to seeing drag everywhere, which is amazing, they take advantage of it and it doesn't seem as important or special. I find sometimes we become background noise. The lovely thing about this new area and crowd is that this is all so new and exciting to them. Some of these people have never seen a drag or burlesque show, so it's a whole new world to them and they are so involved in the show. Everyone has eyes on you and they are loving every second of it. It's refreshing because the queens

and burlesque performers in this city work so hard, so it's nice to feel appreciated for the hard work we do."

Fred Luk, the owner of The Red Tomato and sister restaurant Fred's Not Here, gave BoBo full creative control over the show, which is every producers dream. However, as BoBo notes this comes with its own challenges. "Throwing a weekly show is insanity. By the time the Friday show is done I'm already pumping out the poster and my guests for the following week, and trying to get all those people who loved it to come back. It keeps me on my toes and keeps my creativity flowing, so I'm grateful to have a show like this that is pushing my limits."

"My favourite thing is joking around with all the straight guys, and then when I bring out the burlesque performer I get to watch their jaws hit the floor as they swing their nipple tassels around Chicken Parmesan," Bobo laughs.




