







There's no shortage of events to take in over the next couple of weeks, from Christmas themed entertainment and comedy showcases, to cruising Lake Ontario on New Year's Eve.





The Metropolitan Community Church of Toronto (MCCT) presents their 25th Annual Christmas Eve Service on December 24th at Roy Thomson Hall. This inclusive event attracts people of all faiths and backgrounds, with Rev. Dr. Brent Hawkes delivering a Yuletide message featuring the celebrated Choir of MCCT under the leadership of music director Diane Leah. For a different take on the holy tradition. Jesus Christ Superstar is playing at the Lower Ossington Theatre until January 24th. This independent production company consistently presents shows of grand quality with a bit of campiness. Past productions have included Hedwig and the Angry Inch, Joseph and the Technicolour Dreamcoat, and Hair. For 2015, their newest presentation is Don't Stop Me Now! The Music of Queen, featuring all the hits performed live in an epic vet intimate showcase that any Queen fan won't want to miss!

For those who want to spice things up a bit, by dressing up for a night on the town, the annual holiday tradition of the Nutcracker takes place on stage at the elegant Four Seasons Centre for the Performing Arts December 13th to January 3rd. This brand new show specifically created for the historic Princess of Wales Theatre will have the stage frozen to allow these world champions and Olympians to present their brilliant moves for a limited engagement from December 24th to January 4th.

If you're looking for something more relaxed, and perhaps a bit raunchy, then a night of laughs might be in order. The team at Second City have put together Holidazed & Confused, a new collection of satirical sketches and songs that lovingly lampoon all the absurd rituals, stresses, and obligations of the festive season. It runs right through until January 1st. Finally, this year's annual holiday farce from Ross Petty Productions is Cinderella - The Gags to Riches Family Musical. These shows are always a hoot, with enough one-liners and gay references to please any king or queen. The show is now playing at the Elgin Theatre until January 4th with Kids in the Hall alumni Scott Thompson at his best as the Fairy Godmother.





This night can go from elegant to extreme, and sometimes both in the same evening over the span of a couple hours. Kama Restaurant on King West presents the legendary Jaymz Bee with his ensemble of entertainers for a night of cool jazz and spicy Indian cuisine. Formal or cocktail attire is encouraged. Why not bring in a new year filled with laughter? Tom Green presents his hilarious, high-wire comic styling on stage as host of the 14th annual Comedy Extravaganza to Massey Hall. The show features several wellknown comics and is curated by Yuk Yuk's founder Mark Breslin. How about a New Year's Eve Gala Dinner Cruise for something completely different? Enjoy dinner and music while taking in the views of the Toronto skyline aboard the heated and enclosed Mariposa Cruises Northern Spirit, If being completely outdoors is more your thing, head to Nathan Phillips Square to skate on the city's famous ice rink to the sounds of a local DJ, enjoy live musical performances from top Toronto talent, and a spectacular fireworks presentation at midnight.

It's also one of the busiest nights at bars and clubs across the city, so we've highlighted a couple places to hit up across the city. There's no shortage of parties happening along Church Street in the heart of the Village. Pick a spot, get there early, and find a hottie to lock lips with to ring in the New Year with sizzle. If you're looking to dance, Fly Nightclub has DJ's Sumation and Mark Falco on the decks spinning sexy beats throughout the night, while Buddies in Bad Times has two rooms of fun with DJ K-Tel spinning top 40 hits in the Chamber and DJ Triple-X spinning retro alternative in the Cabaret. Both are Village staples with great drinks, great staff and never a cover.

For those on the eastside of town, WAYLA is bringing two of the city's biggest pop dance parties together for one night only. Pop Machine and Bang Bang DJ\s will battle it out for the supremacy of pop, with a special performance by Scarlett Bobo. West end queers can head to The Steady Café on Bloor West to catch Essence Brown, three Toronto boys serving classic hip-hop, R&B, and dancehall. Or if a Latin vibe is what you're after, swing by El Convento Rico for a medley of dance tunes hosted by newly crowned Miss El Convento Rico, Jasmine Black, with performances by Mr. Rico and Donnarama.





a filmmaker whose new project is intriguingly entitled Jesus Meets the Gay Man.

A feature-length documentary, its mission is to define the difference between Christianity, a religion based on love, and so-called 'Churchianity', an intolerant fireand-brimstone approach favored by Christian bigots who protest at gay funerals and pride marches. It does so by posing the simple question, "What would Jesus say to a modern-day gay man?"

Jean-Claude and I both attended the very first Timmins Pride March in September, a stirring event in which over 500 people marched down the main streets on a Saturday afternoon. Neither of us ever thought we would live to see the day. He and co-producer Tim Doucette were anxious to interview the only two Christian protesters in the village, but typically, they weren't very educated about gays or about Christianity. Still, the footage makes a valuable point, that homosexuality and Christianity are seen as polar opposites, whereas nothing could be further from the

"I love Pope Francis," declares Jean-Claude. "I think he was brought in to bring the church into the 21st century." And so will Jean-Claude's movie, with recreations (featuring a historically accurate but contentious non-white Jesus) and celebrity interviews, including Carla Collins, Richard Ryder, and The Village People, among others.

"Most Christians aren't aware that the Bible was put together under Constantine the Great 325 years after Christ's death," says Jean-Claude. "And that's where



a child, growing up in Timmins, I thought I the problems began," he continues, referring to the whole 'man shall not lie with another man' stuff. But the documentary is also about how gay people have rejected Christ as a result, often with ridicule, like jokes about how Christ was a mama's boy who hung out with twelve dudes and a hooker.

> Jean-Claude was a church organist and an enthusiast of the Jesus Movement of the mid 70s. Though he always knew he was gay, he married a woman and stayed with her for seven tumultuous years, even spending time in a deprogramming cult. He admits that like me, he is not a regular churchgoer. Yet what, other than laziness, is preventing us and thousands of other gay men, from going to the MCC? Is it because most of us are hung over on a Sunday morning, or is it because mass is just too boring? For most gay men, 'worship' is something you do to a hunk, not a deity.



Our conversation wandered into fond memories of growing up in Timmins the 70s and 80s, of "those small cut Adidas shorts that left nothing to the imagination" and about how his sister stole all his boyfriends. Jean-Claude is a funny guy, so I expect the movie to be both informative and entertaining. I can't help but think that in about a year from now, most of us will be talking about Jesus Meets the Gay Man.

A KODAK MOMENT

Boyd Kodak is an award winning trans activist, musician, writer, activist, filmmaker, curator, and festival/entertainment director. Boyd put together both educational and artistic programs for festivals worldwide. In 2012 he was inducted into the International LGBT Hall of Fame.



I've known Nichola Ward for many years. She has indeed contributed significantly, and is a prominent part of our community. Nichola (Nicki) Ward was born in London and lives in Toronto, Canada where she is an award winning writer, performer and poet. Her work embraces the energy of "spoken word" and the formality of "page poetry".

She is the founder of the publishing and performance group Ground Queero and a long term member of the respected LGBT writer's group "OUTwrites". She is the author of "Little Sarah - Wordkeeper", "Babylon Alley - A Play for Voices", "Found Album" and "Jackie's Not a Real Girl"

Boyd: Nicki, tell us what have you been doing over the least year?

Nichola: As a word artist, a lot of the work that I do is solitary or at least is prepared in solitude. Much of the year has been about preparation. In addition to writing new work, I've been trying to assemble hundreds of pieces into a single, publishable form. As part of that process, I've been re-introduced to some earlier work of mine that I'd like to produce and perform again. Babylon Alley (An epic performance poem from some years ago) is something I'd like to take to the stage and see how it's grown.

Boyd: During that time, which was the one most exciting event for you?

Nichola: I'm getting to a point in my life where I don't crave quite as much "excitment" - However, since I see political activism as an extension of my artistic practice there's always plenty to focus on.

Although it isn't really "exciting" probably the most satisfying manifestation of our community's activism is the Trans Memorial in the 519 park. It's been gratifying to be a small part of that process.

Boyd: What are you looking forward to over for the next year?

Nichola: I'm looking forward to seeing more visibility of trans people at all levels of engagement. Not just as "tokens" used to get grant money - But trans people in positions of genuine authority and influence.

Boyd: Where and when can we see your work?

Nichola: Obviously the website www.NicholaWard. com is a good choice. There's a fan page on facebook that links to occasional events and videos. I'm part of a couple of regular events such as "Plasticine Poetry". "Inkslinger", etc.


Boyd: Is there a message that you would like to share with our readers?

RANSGENDER PARENTS



Owen caught up with director Rémy Huberdeau to talk about his recent documentary film Transgender Parents, which will screen on The Doc Channel at 8pm on Monday December 8th. The documentary explores the experiences of parents who are trans

Owen: I understand Transgender Parents is based on a short documentary you made, Transforming Family, which is making waves on Youtube. How has your work been received?

Rémy: The design was for [the film] to be free and accessible on-line, and for people to programme it as they wish. People really ran with that. I was telling a friend about it, and she went on Youtube to find the film. The first thing that came up was a version of the film with Russian subtitles, which I think is pretty cool in terms of everything that's happening in Russia these days. That really encapsulates the spirit of wanting people to take ownership of my work.

Owen: I really admired the respect and range of experiences conveyed in your film. How did you build those relationships?

Rémy: This was a tough project coming from an underrepresented community, so the expectations were quite high, and rightly so. My team and I thought it was essential to get a cross-section of intersections of identity, to drive home that trans people are everywhere, in all regions and all communities. As a non-Indigenous Canadian, part of my responsibility is to make space for Indigenous people to speak for themselves. And that's also true in LGBTQ and


trans communities. The last person to come onboard was Aiyyana Maracle, the Haudenosaunee great-grandmother. That's just an example of the importance of following through with the value of a diversity of representation.

Owen: This film came about when trans people reflected on the need for materials discussing parenting from a trans perspective. What's the relationship between creating an artistic piece of cinema while also addressing a political topic?

Rémy: I went to a talk at the ImagineNative Film Festival a couple weeks ago, and Joseph Boyden, author of the Canada Reads-winning novel The Orenda, was asked a similar question. He said, "Take care of the story and the rest will follow." Meaning if you tell the story well, all your other hopes for the storytelling will fall into place, including the politics.

Owen: What's next for you?

Rémy: I guess the next big project I'm hoping to make is going to be about the Michif language, which is a French-Cree creole language from the Prairies. So it will be a really different piece around decolonization, language, and culture.


